The work of Lacan, theorizes the subject in terms of desire in a way which provides resources for going beyond limitations inherent in a humanistic version of positioning theory. Althusser developed this into a theory of the interpellated ideological subject, while Foucault's work relates the subject to discourse, politics and power.
