Management Of The Pregnant Mare

Pregnant mares should have access to abundant quantities of quality hay. They should also have unlimited access to clean fresh water—preferably from a running stream or the tap.

Managing Pregnant Mares - The Horse

Normal health care management should be followed with the pregnant mare (dental care, hoof care, immunizations). If the mare is prone to pneumovagina ("windwucking", leads to endometritis or uterine infection), a Caslick's closure may be performed to partially suture the labia.

Management of the Pregnant Mare. Gestation Length. The average gestation length (duration of pregnancy) of mares is 335 to 340 days, but can range from 320 to 370 days. There may be much variability among mares, but most individually follow similar patterns year after year.

Management of the pregnant mare.

A mare should gain 9-12% of her original weight during the pregnancy (includes fetus, placenta, fluids). A 1100# mare should gain between 100-130# during gestation . However, two thirds of the total weight gain occurs during the final three months of gestation.

3.2. Overfeeding the pregnant mare. How much weight the mare should put on in pregnancy is a crucial question, especially as overfeeding commonly occurs in the equine industry. The broodmare is often fed a high-energy diet containing lots of soluble carbohydrates such as starch, in an attempt to ensure a healthy foal at birth.

Management of the pregnant mare and long-term consequences ...

Mares should be managed attentively during pregnancy to help ensure the birth of a strong healthy foal with no injury incurred by the dam. Maintaining the mare in good health, being familiar with the signs of impending parturition, and preparing a foaling environment conducive to mare and foal health increase the likelihood of a healthy foal.

Expectant Mare: Assuring the Health and Well-Being of the ...

During this time, the mare should be on good-quality legume or grass hay and a concentrate ration of 12%–14% protein. A mare weighing 1,000–1,200 pounds (454–544 kg) can be expected to gain 150–200 pounds during the last trimester with the proper diet. A body condition score of 6.5–7.5 is ideal for most pregnant mares at foaling.
